For every man there openeth a way

And every man decideth

And all the rest on misty flats
Drift to and fro
But every man and woman decideth

The way their souls shall go.

I am pleased that the hon. member brought the motion forward, and pleased too that he is so anxious that all of us should agree. I am most pleased to associate myself with the motion worded in this way. I think we should remember that what we do or say is of little importance because we are really in their hands, the hands of the generation called youth; the future is theirs, not ours.
