This country has suffered the loss of hundreds of millions of dollars in lost revenues because the Government of Canada has failed to develop a Canadian merchant fleet. The petitioners humbly pray that the Government immediately move forward to develop a Canadian merchant fleet, which would obviously result in the expansion of shipbuilding and allied trade in this country. It is my pleasure to present this petition on behalf of those individuals.

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Wherefore the undersigned, your petitioners, humbly pray and call upon Parliament that the Government be encouraged immediately to implement a sensible and effective marine policy that will result in the creation of a Canadian merchant fleet and the expansion of Canadian shipbuilding and allied industries.
