

From some cause, in July and August no fish were seen moving until late in October, when the lower portion of it filled in a few days with breeding fish. It was perfectly stocked with both parr and smolt. Why the old fish did not enter until so late is unaccountable. Could the continuous running of trains have produced this effect in low water months may be questioned? There must be some cause why it has so fallen away. In conclusion, I do not prophecy, but if the regulations are properly enforced and rivers carefully guarded, a steadily increasing stock can be confidently looked for in the future.
