What a Field would fuch a he gave them. Proceeding at this Day have opened to the popular Declaimer; how pathetically would he have complained in every Harangue " to fee " not only fo many fovereign, and fo many " fubordinate Princes, and not only Princes, " but petty Lords, fubfidized almost all over " Europe, in Germany, in the Low Countries, in " France, every where; and the Treasure of " England, the vital Blood of the Nation, " ftreaming from a thousand Wounds, and " transfused into a thousand foreign Chan-" nels." And yet at this Time England bore a much smaller Proportion in Point of Wealth to those Countries, and a much larger one in Point of idle Hands, than the does now, without all Comparison; and notwithstand, this Conduct of our Princes, has been cenfured by no Hiftorian; on the contrary, it has ever been highly and justly commended, and held up as a Pattern to all fucceeding Monarchs. The Example of Edward I. was followed by Edward III. Henry V. trod in the fame Steps; and indeed all our Kings, except fuch as were a Difgrace to their Thrones, and a Misfortune to their People, never flighted the Continent, from the earlieft Accounts we have, to the prefent most interesting Period. And here I appeal to the Hearts of those, who oppose our Treaties, whether they think we could do any Thing more acceptable to our Enemies, than to drop all Connection with the Continent, and renounce these subfidiary G Treaties,

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
