" mitted to be made. The workmen, ou ged to work in water and "foft mud, laboured in vain. The work they performed in the "reflux of the tide, the influx wafhed away. Thus a month was "hamefully wafted, and no progrefs made towards taking the fort. "At length, Lord Cornwallis fent for the gentleman who had of-"fered to repair the dykes, informed him that it muft be done pre-"vioufly to the erecting of the batteries, and requefted he would "undertake it. This be did with chearfulnefs; aud although the "breaches were as large again as when he first proposed the repairs "the work was finished in fix days—The batteries were immediately "erected without difficulty, and opened on the 10th."

It has been before observed, that orders were given to the Chief Engineer, upon the King's troops entering Philadelphia, to construct redoubts, and to form the necessary lines of communication, for the better fecurity of that city; that on this work he was directed to employ the inhabitants, to be furnished, at my particular request, by *Mr. Galloway*, for the relief of the foldiery; and that this affistance fell far short of that gentleman's affurances.

The neceffity of repairing the dykes on Province and Blackeley's iflands, before an effectual progrefs could be made in erecting batteries againft Mud Ifland, was an object of fiill more confequence; and any offers to effect it, inftead of being rejected, would have been gladly accepted. I am confident that none were made to me, and have the most explicit authority for faying, that fuch offers having been made never arrived to the knowledge of those immediately intrusted with the execution of the work. The conduct of it was under the direction of Earl Cornwallis, until I moved to Philadelphia with the main army on the 19th of October; and those, who have a just opinion of his lordifhip's zeal to promote his Majesty's fervice by every possible means, will hardly fuppose him to have been inattentive in this effential point.

Eleven dyke-men were, I find, fent to the engineer on the 22d of October, and, I am very ready to grant, were of confiderable fervice for the few days they affifted. But it cannot be conceived that these men effected in *fix days*, by their own labour, the stopping of breaches that had encreased to be as large again under

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
