## CARD-EXERCISE XXXV.

### Catnip-Leaf, slightly Conventionalized.

Draw a vertical line forming the midrib and petiole of the leaf, and divide it into thirds. Through the lower point of division, draw a horizontal line two-thirds as long as the vertical line. Add the veins. Around the whole, draw the crenate margin of the leaf. The base of the leaf is cordate, or heart-

shaped; its apex acute. The petiole, or leaf-stalk, occupies one-half of the lower third of the vertical line. As a whole, the leaf is decidely oval.

# CARD-EXERCISE XXXVI.

# German Ivy-Leaf, slightly Conventionalized.

Draw a vertical line forming the midrib and petiole

of the leaf, and divide it into
three equal parts. Through the
points of division and through
the lower end of the line, draw
horizontal lines, the upper and
lower a little mere than half,
the central a little less than
half, as long as the vertical
line. Add the side ribs, and,
around the whole, draw the

margin of the leaf. The margin is entire; the leaf
