CAUSED BY OPEN SWITCH.

Pittsburg, Pa., Dec. 1.—The fast Chicago, Baltimore & Ohio train, No. 10, bound from Cleveland, Ohio, to New York, ran into an open switch at Gueffey coal mines, about fifteen miles east of Pittsburg. to-night, killing the engineer, Harry Sheppard, and seriously injuring Charles Denny, the fireman, and F. S. Farmer, the baggagemaster.
