CITY HALL NOTES.

Reductions in Assessments—Writs Against the City—Opening of Cherry Street Bridge—Island Refinement Lease.

H. Cantin and a number of others have petitioned against a creek sidewalk on the north side of Wellington street, and for the city to give an order of appeal against the decision of the Board of Assessments, relative to the assessment of the rails, poles and wires of the Toronto Railway Company on August 29.

A petition sufficiently signed, has been presented against the proposed sidewalk on the east side of Applegate street, a wood walk being called for instead.

Manager Hill has invited the City Council to issue, with the directors of the Exhibition Association, the 31st and 32nd to be present at the opening.

Ald. Lamb, Assistant Engineer, has presented a report on the proposed widening of the Cherry street bridge yesterday.

Samuel Newburn has issued a writ against the city claiming \$1000 damages for a dog which he lost on the 15th of Clinton street. Another writ has been issued by Christopher Williams, claiming \$500 damages for a dog which he lost on the 15th of Waterloo road.

At the Court House meeting yesterday several appeals were considered, but limited numbers of small sums were struck off buildings.

E. A. Macdonald, who intends to proceed with his injunction to prevent R. J. Fleming occupying the position of Assessor, has submitted an appeal.

The temperance advocates are somewhat disappointed in the outcome of the meeting of the Premier's council, a new law of the C. O. R. is being considered, but it is expected that this will be a failure.

The doctor's Daniel Lamb is at work making a channel to the waterfront Club building so that the ferry boats can carry the members of the club to the waterfront.

The City Engineer yesterday gave orders to go on with the gravel pavement on Melburne avenue, from Dufferin to Cowanessons.

The wheat markets were very strong today in Chicago there was an advance of $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ cent. September and December wheat advanced $\frac{3}{4}$ cent. and closed at 90. Other western markets sympathetic. The local market is also strong, with quotations the highest in two years.

LOCAL BREADSTUFFS MARKET.

Flour—The flour market continues very strong in sympathy with wheat. Straight rollers sold at $\$4.25$ Toronto freight, and some brands held higher.

Brns.—The market is quiet. Bran is strong for bran and $\$9$ for shorts. Bran is quoted here at $\$10$ to $\$11$.

Wheat—The demand continues good for export. Sales of new red wheat were made in the morning at 78c and later in the day at 80c to 81c. White sold at 80c to 81c, and 81c to 82c, and at 81c middle freight for old. Manitoba wheat is quoted higher, at 85c to 86c. Fort William for No. 1 hard, and at 86c to 88c Gederick or Owen Sound, and is limited and prices nominal.

Buckwheat—The demand is limited and prices nominal.

Outmeal—The market is quiet and prices steady at $\$3.10$ to $\$3.25$ for cars on truck to 24c, and 20c bushels of old at 26c to 28c. The market is firm with sales outside at 45c north and west, and at 45c to 46c.
