Up to the United States.

Mr. Walker is not altogether opposed to reciprocity, but is sure that there is no hope for it, until the United States makes the first move. Canada has taken the initiative for the last time. If the United States were to take the matter up and begin negotiations doubtless something could be accomplished, if not too much was undertaken at first. Mr. Walker would advise that at first reciprocity be confined to free trade in a limited number of commodities which the great fined to free trade in a limited number of commodities which the great majority of the people of both countries would like to have free. He suggested lumber, 'coal, cattle and wheat as commodities that might be tried. If the experiment were found to be satisfactory to both parties, the scope of reciprocity could be extended. Personally, he would greatly like to see some such approach made to fair trade, but was very skeptical about the possibility of an American initiative and was opposed to the Canadians making another trial.


