EDWARD THE PEACEMAKER BERESFORD COINS PHRASE

Lord Charles Also Has Pleasant Things to Say About President Roosevelt.

London, July 9.—At the Pilgrims' Club luncheon to the visiting American officers at the Carlton Club this afternoon, Vice-Admiral Lord Charles Beresford read a message of regret from the Prince of Wales.

Lord Charles said, the belief of the day was coming when King Edward would be known as "Edward the Peacemaker."

"We like the man. We like the strong, generous man. What I may call the noblest of human men. The President will do his level best to bring the two English-speaking nations together in one happy union."

Admiral Cotton, in replying, testified to the warm feeling existing between the two nations.
