PENNILESS CAMPAIGN

South Bend, Ind., Sept. 24 .- William Jennings Bryan has written a letter to The Tribune in which he declares that in order to win the Democratic party in this state must conduct a "penniless campaign that will appeal to the con-science and patriotism of the people." In part the letter says:
