Despite the fact that when Chairman A. B. The board of education last night determined to ask for arbitration on the values of the property which they desire to buy for the north school site, and furthermore to tell the Loard of control that they must have the property of their choice. It was to the effect that instead of the new school they would recommend an enlargment of Huron-street school.
