ment, appearing always neat and in a dress of home manufacture. You will save half your materials for fodder, by cutting your hay, straw, corntalks, &c. with Willis' or some other straw cutter, then mix your cut odder with Indian meal, bran, soaked or boiled corn, sliced potatoes, or other roots, cut so fine that there will be no danger of the animals' thoking themselves. Cattle well wintered are half summered. Agriculture of late has, like many other arts and sciences, undergone a great change, within a few years, the farming interest has been most asonishingly redeemed from the unjust humiliation into which it had sunk. When we reflect upon the entire dependance of every other profession, rade, or employment, on agriculture, we cannot but be sensible of its mportance, and of the respect and esteem to which its votaries are enti-
