

U. S. GOVERNMENT ADVANCE \$35,000,000 MORE

Washington, Sept. 24—The government today advanced \$35,000,000 to Great Britain, bringing the total advanced that country thus far up to \$1,190,000,000, and the total of all credits to the Allies up to \$2,426,400,000.

RECENT DEATHS

The Late George Cusack.

General were the expressions of regret yesterday when it became known that George Cusack, a well known butcher and grocer, of this city, had passed away. By his genial manner and upright business dealings he made scores of friends who will hear of his death with deep regret. Mr. Cusack leaves, besides his wife, three sons—John J. Cusack, Harold F. and Cedric J.; and three daughters—Mrs. Thos. M. Cogger, Haymarket square; Mrs. F. L. Carvell, of Haymarket square; and Miss Phyllis at home. From there he was removed to his home, where he gradually kept sinking until the end came yesterday morning at an early hour.

This is the second bereavement the family has been called upon to bear within a few months, as Mr. Cusack's eldest son, George, gave his life on the western front, having been killed on July 19, 1917.

The funeral will take place on Wednesday morning at 8.30 from his late residence, 33 Marsh road, to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, where requiem high mass will be celebrated.

CROWN PRINCE'S ATTACKS FAIL

Violent attacks by the soldiers of the German Crown Prince against the new French positions northeast of Verdun on Monday were checked with heavy losses by General Petain's men and the Germans gained nothing.

The assaults began with an attack on a front of about a mile and a quarter, north of the Bois Le Chaume. Only in the centre of the assaulting line were the Germans able to reach the French positions, the artillery dispersing them elsewhere. The French fought valiantly and remained masters of the situation, after inflicting heavy losses on the Germans.

Simultaneously the German Crown Prince threw forward two secondary attacking forces, one north of Besonvaux, south of the Bois Le Chaume and the other southeast of Beaumont, northwest of the wood. Here the French did not wait for the Germans to reach their trenches, but went out to meet the attackers, who were driven back with losses.

Later in the day, the Crown Prince hurled two new attacks against the Bois Le Chaume, only to meet further failure. Again the French drove the Germans back with casualties and in addition, captured fifty prisoners.
