Young British Fliers Admit That It Takes Nerve

Machine Guns the Worst; Canadian Describes the Thrill He Got When His Engine Balked Over the German Lines

London, Oct. 12.—(Correspondence of The Associated Press).—"It's all right so long as you can see 'em, or hear 'em," said "Tommy" Brennan of the Royal Flying Corps, "but any man who tells you he can fly over an 'Archie' and get a 'flaming onion' right ahead of him without ducking and wishing they wouldn't come so close or make so much noise, has never been up in an aeroplane. Take it from me."

"I'll never forget the first time they got close to me," declared "Boy" Tytle. "My only thought was that I would never shoot a phossifer again. I knew exactly how a bird must feel when a hunter opens fire."
