

PROCESSION MORE THAN MILE LONG

Great Concourse at Funeral of
James Lowell on Sunday Afternoon

The funeral of James Lowell, held yesterday afternoon from his residence, South Bay, was the largest in the history of the community. A little after one o'clock teams began to gather, all the side roads contributing their contingent to swell the assembly from the city and Fairville and soon the large field in front of the house had to be utilized as all the yard and roadway were filled. Service was commenced at 2:30 by Rev. H. R. Boyer, assisted by Rev. W. H. Townsend. The Fairville Baptist choir under the leadership of H. P. Allingham, sang "Only Remembered" and "Abide With Me," while Miss Blende-Thompson sang a solo very effectively.

Rev. Mr. Boyer spoke of the untimely death of Mr. Lowell, he referred to Mr. Lowell as a gentleman always and one of nature's noblemen, his life a splendid example of unselfish service. His loss would be felt not only in this vicinity but in St. John, New Brunswick, and even the dominion itself. The county needed more of his type whom the lusts of office could not buy or swerve from public duty.

His watchword was the community first and all personal matters he relegated to second place. He would be missed by a large circle outside his immediate family, for the needy had lost a real benefactor, Fairville a worthy representative and the citizens a true friend. Mr. Boyer fittingly spoke of the last words of Mr. Lowell before relapsing into unconsciousness, "Be good, meet me in Heaven," and from this he drew lessons of condolence and hope for the bereaved ones and exemplified the life of the deceased to his hearers.

The funeral procession was more than a mile long. About 150 men were in line and more than 100 teams, and the march, instead of breaking up as usual a short distance from the house, proceeded through South Bay along the Manawagonish Road, and Main street, Fairville to Cedar Hill, where interment took place.

Such a manifestation of respect is rarely paid a public man, whatever his station, as in the concourse were noticed a city commissioner, members of the bench, bar and medical fraternity, side by side or driving with the merchants, artisans, millmen, farmers and laborers of the county, all recognizing the strength of character and kindly disposition as well as faithful public life of the deceased. His memory will long remain fresh, for he is remembered by what he has done.



SOME HARD KNOCKS FOR H. F. McLEOD, M. P.

York County Member Does Not
Appear to Have Impressed Some
Papers

The Ottawa Journal, the chief Tory paper at the capital, says of York's M. P., "H. F. McLeod, the recently elected Conservative for York, N. B., has a curious style. His SPEECH LAST NIGHT WAS SOMEWHAT OF A HARANGUE, AND OF AN ANCIENT TYPE, ALTOGETHER UNUSUAL IN PRESENT DAY PARLIAMENTS. IT WAS NOT IMPRESSIVE."

The Ottawa correspondent of the St. John Globe a paper friendly to the government says: "Mr. McLeod also brought applause from his fellow Conservatives by some pointed things about Mr. Carrell. But Mr. McLeod does not present a case very well and sometimes mistakes noise for effective stunts. His future would have made a better job of it."

COURT MARTIAL FOR UNRULY ARMY OFFICERS IN ULSTER

Sir John French Held This View—New
Light on Historic Incident

London, May 11.—The official record of the verbal instructions given by Colonel Seeley, late secretary for war, to General Sir Arthur Paget, commander-in-chief of the forces in Ireland, regarding officers serving in Ulster, is issued. Colonel Seeley states that at a conference at the War Office, General Paget strongly urged that in the few exceptional cases where officers have a direct family connection with the disturbed area in Ulster, so that in the event of serious trouble arising their future private relations might be irretrievably compromised if they were engaged with our troops, they should be permitted to remain behind either on leave or with details. Sir John French and Sir Spencer Ewart having expressed their concurrence with this view it was decided that this course be followed.

In all other cases Sir Arthur Paget wished to be able to say that any officer hesitating to comply with orders or threatening to resign should be removed. Sir John French was of the opinion that such officers should be court-martialed, a view which he had urged a year ago. Upon Sir Spencer Ewart pointing out the technical difficulties and delay which might be involved in such a course, Sir John French agreed that for the present removal should be the course followed.

Found Dead in Bed
Mrs. Mabel Leonard, a middle-aged woman, residing in Sheffield street, was found dead in bed Saturday forenoon in her home by Eva Morrell, who had been taking care of her during a slight illness. Coroner Roberts was called to the home but after looking into the circumstances of the death he found that no public investigation would be necessary.

RECTOR DISAPPROVES OF WOMAN AS CHURCH SEXTON

London, May 11.—A curious church controversy has suddenly developed at Crowland, near Spalding, as a consequence of the action of the Rev. S. C. Calver, the new rector of Crowland Abbey, in discharging the woman sexton, Miss S. J. Hill.

For some years Miss Hill has been sexton of the famous abbey, and the appointment has been in the family for nearly 200 years. The sextons during that time have been her brother, her father, her grandfather, her great-grandfather, and her great-great-grandfather. Of the latter, a tablet in Crowland Abbey records the fact that he lost his sight by walking in a snowstorm when forty years of age, but despite this, he could go into the churchyard and find easily every grave he was desired to point out.

Mr. Calver has been rector of Crowland only a short time, and a few weeks ago he gave the sexton notice to leave the abbey cottage, a house built many years ago specially for the sexton of the church. Miss Hill, at a meeting of the vestry, gave up the keys under protest, and it was announced that Alfred Holland had been appointed verger by the rector.

The parishioners contend that the rector is striving to take away from them what they say is one of their rights as parishioners, namely, the appointment of sexton by the vestry meeting. The rector said he was not in favor of women sextons because they could not fulfill all the duties of the office satisfactorily.
