The members of the Association to whom districts have been assigned have visited the families in them at least once every month. When sickness or the infirmities of age have required it, their visits have been frequent, always willingly paid and gratefully received.

Over 200 Records with St. Andrew's Notes have been circulated monthly during the year, keeping every household fully informed of the work and wants of the Church and the congregation. It is pleasing to report that owing to the satisfactory state of the funds the price of the Record with Notes has been reduced.

A stained glass window has been placed in the Church at a cost of \$1,000. The scene depicted is that of the Apostle Andrew introducing the Greeks to Christ. The design may be said to be that of the Association, and it has been very well executed by Messrs. Castle & Son, Montreal. It is hoped that it will be considered suitable, and will meet the approval of the congregation.

For upholstering the Church a house to house collection was made by the Association, instead of holding a sale, and the result has been satisfactory. Cushions of the best material covered with crimson damask are now being provided for every pew.

Additional communion plate, two cups and six salvers, has also been furnished, for which a subscription was made chiefly by the communicants.

Silver collection plates have also been supplied out of the funds of the Association.

Towards the salary of the City Missionary one member of the Association has received \$48.75.

The collections for the Schemes of the Church have not yet been completed, but it is hoped that there will be no falling off if there be no increase. \$1,000 a year for the missions of the Church is what the Association is aiming at, and which it will reach in the near future if not this year.

It is with much regret that the Association reports that owing to change of residence for a time, Miss Strange has resigned the office of Recording Secretary, the duties of which she discharged so admirably for many years. The Association feels that it owes a debt of gratitude to Miss Strange and looks forward to welcoming
