French-speaking candidates may omit Shakspeare, but will be expected to translate into French passages from the first half of the "Vicar of Wakefield," and answer questions of grammar and parsing. They will be required to have a critical knowledge of the "Athalie." Similarly, English-speaking candidates may omit "Racine," but will be expected to translate into English passages from the first half of "Telemaque," and answer questions of grammar and parsing. They will be required to have critical knowledge of the "Merchant of Venice."
