MANY TROOPS TAKEN.

Port of Spain, Trinidad, B. W. J., July 3.—General Mendosa has reappeared in active operations assisted by Generals Solangie, Pancho, Botala and Au lar. The government troops were nearly all captured. A hundred of them, however, escaped with Gonzalez Peacho, governor of the state of Lara, in the lirection of Trajillo. Four Venezuelan officers and General Larela, the chief-incommand at Barquisameto, escaped to the Port Tuacus. General Cinto Lara has been appointed governor of Barquisimeto by the revolutionists.
