The present winter is proving a most favorable winter for lumbermen operations. The cutting is now well completed and lumbermen are hauling the logs from the yards to the landings. There is about three feet of snow in the lumber regions, and it promises to be a very favorable spring for driving operations, since swamps are frozen, and so the melting snow will run in the streams and rivers instead of being absorbed by the earth. At present the water is very low in the rivers, certainly lower than it has been for many years, but even without the heavy rains that most people are counting on in the early spring at the latest, there is now enough on the ground to insure a good driving pitch on the rivers.
