Imperial Packed; Crowds Enthralled

"The Great Redeemer" a Photoplay With Tremendous Spiritual Impulse.

One of the biggest screen productions of the year is being seen at the Imperial Theatre in Maurice Tourneur's super special in "The Great Redeemer." This is a tremendous drama of absorbing human interest. Yesterday's crowds taxed the capacity of the big house and the picture with its wonderful music made a powerful impression on everybody.

He paints a picture of the Saviour on the wall and a scolding condemned murderer is converted by its visionary effects. For a latter-day miracle is wrought that affects not only the life of Dan Maylo, but those of others in the prison and outside of it.

It is in this phase of the story that contains the biggest punch of all. H. H. Van Loan, who wrote "The Great Redeemer," as well as a number of other big photodramatic screeners, got the idea for this situation from an incident that took place in a western jail. His original story was made into a scenario, and the production was directed by Clarence Brown under the

personal supervision of Maurice Tourneur.

A notable cast appears in the picture. It includes House Peters as Dan Maylo, Marjorie Daw as the girl; Joseph Singleton and Jack McDonald. Toronto, March 22.—Toronto ladies are quoted in interviews in the Globe, as airing rather complimentary views of Sir Henry Drayton's recent statement in Montreal that much of the responsibility for the shrinking of the Canadian dollar in the U. S. could be laid on the shoulders of the housewife.

Vegetable Chowder.

Peel four potatoes, three carrots, one parsnip and onion. Slice one onion and fry brown with a slice of fat salt pork. Add the vegetables, cover with water and simmer tender. Add two cups of tomatoes and more water if necessary.

Finnish Mashed.

Boil a Finnish haddock until the fish can be picked apart. Add a cup and a half of rice milk, a little paprika and a cup of grated cheese. When the cheese is melted add one beaten egg. Stir well and serve very hot.

Consomme of Rice and Carrots.

Parboil and chop two carrots, place a layer of cold boiled rice in a baking dish and add the seasoning and a layer of carrots. Make a sauce with half a cup of water, a cup of milk, a tablespoon of dissolved butter and the seasoning. Pour the dish is full cover with buttered bread crumbs and bake 25 minutes.

Apple Rings.

Cut rather thick slices of apples without paring in rings. Place butter or dripping in a frying pan and when hot, add the apple rings. Fry a brown and then add a little molasses. Serve as soon as the molasses simmers away.

Championship On Percentage

New York, March 22.—A half million dollar purse for Dempsey and Georges was to have fought on the 21st. Of this sum the champion has been withdrawn and the purse will go to a percentage bank engaged in their world's championship.

This announcement was today by Promoter Tex Rickard several conferences with five of the principals.

Under the new agreement taken the form of an amendment to the original contract signed last November, the prize money is to be divided as follows: fifty per cent of the purse to the winner, twenty per cent to the loser, and ten per cent to the promoter. The contract originally called for a purse of \$1,000,000 and a \$200,000 challenge.
