It has been a weather market for colton, spots and futures rising and falling with weather reports. Nervousness as to a possible August corner is still evident. Dry goods are in better demand. At Boston, boot and shoe shipments, though larger than last week, are still far below those of last year. Hides of all kinds are taken as fast as received. Higher prices for leather products seem probable.

The weight of imported iron is pressing on domestic sentiment, though no perceptible effect is yet seen on prices for pigion, which is still in active request for next year's delivery.

Bank clearings for the week ending Aug. 7 aggregate \$2,029,261,401, a decrease of 9 per cent from last week but an increase of 2 per cent over this week as year ago.

Business failures for the week ending Aug. 7 number 169, as against 168 last week, 185 in this week last year, 172 in 1900, 156 in 1899 and 167 in 1898.






