LONDON, Nov. 20. The news correspondent at Hendaya reports that the storm has abated, and Republican troops are again in motion.

The Carlists, yesterday, captured two newspaper correspondents and took them to Andoain, where Gen. Zegala immediately ordered their release.

Several steamships, which sailed from San Sebastian with Republican troops for Santander, put back to day in consequence of heavy weather. The supply of provisions in the city is short for the inhabitants, and the unexpected return of the soldiers has caused distress.

Gortschakoff had final interview with Bismarck to-day, and departed for St. Petersburg. He expressed confidence in the maintenance of peace in Europe for many years.
