

SIXTIETH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Committee of Management of St. George's Society of Quebec,

FOR THE YEAR 1895.

The Committee of Management have the honour to submit the following report of their proceedings during the past year, being the sixtieth since the foundation of the Society.

The anniversary of St. George's Day was celebrated by Divine Service in the Cathedral, at which the Rev. Lennox W. Williams, M.A., one of the Chaplains of the Society, kindly preached an eloquent sermon.

The musical part of the Service was admirably rendered by the talented choir and other ladies and gentlemen under the able direction of Mr. E. A. Bisnop, organist, to all of whom the Society is again indebted for their valuable assistance.

The collection amounted to the handsome sum of \$55.00.

The report of the Sub-Committee of Charity shows the Society has relieved 173 cases of distress during the year, at an outlay of \$427.85. (See report of Sub-Committee of Charity.) All these cases were attended to by the Chairman, Mr. Heber Budden, who dispensed assistance with his usual good judgment and satisfactory results. The thanks of the Society are due to him for his constant devotion and exercise of patience under the circumstances.

The financial affairs of the Society are very satisfactory, for which we are indebted to our worthy treasurer, Mr. F. Billingsley.
