to appear above the waters, for the simple reason that it was the loftiest—in Armenia at all events.

As viewed to-day it gives a notion of the depth of the Flood, inasmuch as the peak is more than three mile about sea level. It is dome-shaped and its slopes for 9,000 feet from the top are covered with everlasting snow and great fields of glitteringies.
