If erected, plainly but substantially, of stone or brick, it is believed that the cost would be moderate, as the ground is level and the foundation and drainage excellent; and the whole amount would not need to be provided till next year, as the erection of the buildings could not now be begun till next spring, except perhaps by putting in foundations.

It is not expected that the addition desired will demand any further annual expenditure, beyond that provided for by the fees of pupils in the Kindergarten and enlarged Primary School; and the work of the Normal School will undoubtedly be vastly increased in efficiency with reference to the training of the best class of teachers for the Elementary and Model Schools.
