forbid) between the said Crowns in Europe, no Act of Hostility, neither at Land nor at Sea, shall however be done by any of the most Serene King of Great Britain's Garisons, Souldiers or Subjects whomsoever of the Islands, Colonies, Forts, Cities and Governments, which now are, or hereafter shall be under the English Dominion in America, against the most Serene most Christian King's Subjects, winhabiting or residing in any of the American Colonies: Likewise reciprocally, that in the abovefaid case of a Breach in Europe, no Act of Hostility, neither at Land nor at Sea, shall however be done by any of the most Serene most Christian King's Garisons, Souldiers or Subjects whomsoever of the Islands, Colonies, Forts, Cities and Governments, which now are, or hereafter shall be under the French Dominion in America, against the most Serene King of Great Britain's Subjects inhabiting in any of the American Colonies, or residing there. But a true and firm Peace and Neutrality shall continue in America between the said British and French Nations in the same manner, as if such Breach in Europe had not happened.
