Ross, Homer Hugo, M.A. (Dundas.)

A descendant of a U. E. Loyalist. S. of the late J. S. Ross, who represented Dundas in the Leg. Assem., Can., and in the Commons from 1861 to 1872, and from 1878 to 1882. B. at Iroquois, 1847. Ed. at the Univ. of Toronto, and graduated with honours, receiving a degree of M.A. in 1870. M. Mary M., second dau. of the late Nicholas Redmond, Esq., of Matilda. Is a merchant. Has held the position of Head Master in the High Schools at Gananoque and Perth, and has been a Municipal Councillor of Iroquois for three years. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Conservative; in favour of freer trade relations with other nations consistent with the development of our own industries.—Iroquois, Ont.

ROWAND, JAMES. (West Bruce.)

Family came from Paisly, Scot., and settled in Can. 1832. B. in Paisley, 1830, and ed. in Toronto. M. 1854. Elizabeth Gowanlock, of Saugeen. A Farmer. Was a Municipal Councillor and Reeve of his Tp. for ten years. Is now a mem. of the Agricultural and Arts Assoc. of Ontario. First returned to Parliament by acclamation at bye election held 19 Oct., 1887; re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.—Dumblane, Ont.

RYCKMAN, SAMUEL SHOBAL. (Hamilton.)

Of U.E. Loyalist descent. B. at Ryckman's Corners, Co. of Wentworth, Ont., 4 Jan., 1849. Ed. at the Common School. Has been engaged in the real estate business, and from 1884 to 1890 carried on retail grocery trade. Was elected an Alderman of Hamilton in 1890, and again returned by acclamation in 1891. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.— Hamilton, Ont.

SANBORN, JOHN ROBBINS. (Shefford.)

Ancestors came from Derbyshire, Eng., and settled in New Hampshire in 1620. S. of A. Sanborn, a native of Canterbury, N.H., who came to Can. in 1834, and was one of the first settlers at South Roxton, Co. of
