JONES, The Rt. Rev. Llewellyn. Bishop of Newfoundland and Bermuda (Ch. of Eng.), was b. in Liverpool, Eng., Oct. 11, 1840. He received his education at the Coll. Inst. in that city, at Cheltenham Coll. and at the public sch., Harrow. Proceeding to Trinity Coll., Cambridge (B.A., 1862; M.A., 1866; D.D., 1878), he further prosecuted his divinity course at the Wells Theol. Coll., and was ordained to the priesthood by the Bp. of Worcester. 1865. After being licensed as curate to the parish of Bromsgrove, where he served for 10 yrs., His Lordship was presented by the Bp. of Worcester to the rectory of Little Here-

P. of the Bd. of Trade; and was mayor of the city, 1887-88. On the formation of Mr. Greenway's Admn., Jan., 1888, he was apptd. Treas. therein, and was returned to the Legislature for the constituency of Shoal Lake. At the g. e. same year, he was returned for North Winnipeg, and continued its representative till the close of the Legislature; he resigned the Tressurership, May, 1889. He is now Gentle Mangr. of the Massey-Harris Co., Toronto. Politically, he is a Lib. He was one of the promoters of the Can. Electric Ry. for a line between Cobourg and Suspension Bridge, N.
