I have the honor to request a statement showing what Islands the Dominion Government claimed or claim to be entitled to, on the north shore of Georgian Bay,

and the grounds of such claim.

As soon as this information is obtained, my Government will suggest some mode by which the questions in dispute between the two Governments in respect of these Islands, and in respect of the Islands on the east shore of Georgian Bay, south of Moose Deer Point, may be determined.
