

Thirdly. To provide the donors or the survivor, of them with a horse, harnessed, to a suitable vehicle for every season, whenever requested, to go to church, or elsewhere, except while needed for farm work.

Fourthly. During the remainder of the said donors' lifetime, to support, maintain and keep them up in his house and with his family, in the hereby transferred premises, in a proper, decent and sufficient way and manner, by constantly providing them with all the necessaries of life, such as meat, drink, clothing, washing, fuel, light, and all other necessaries of life, whatsoever, as well in health as in sickness, and to cause them to lie decently buried, at their death.

Fifthly. Should the said donors, at any time hereafter, be displeased, or dissatisfied to live any longer with the said donee, and be supported, such as heinamaw, set forth, for any cause or reason whatsoever, the said donee shall be expressly bound, upon three months' notice duly served upon him, the said donee, by the said two donors, if they be both living, or by the survivor of them, should one of said donors be then deceased, to well and truly pay or cause to be well and truly paid, in lieu and instead of all the other obligations hereinbefore stipulated in behalf of the said donors, unto the said donee, while they may be both alive, the sum of two hundred dollars, currency, in quarterly instalments, the first whereof to become due and be payable at the expiration of three months from the date of said notice, thereafter to continue every three months during the time both donors may be living, but from the time of one of said donors' death, one hundred dollars, said currency, only, to be paid to the survivor of said donors, during the remainder of said survivor's lifetime, in quarterly instalments as aforesaid.
