No. 2 S.F.T.S.	7-3-42		Overcast in the morning, with snow in the afternoon. Flying in the morning only. Lt. Col. W.M. Tow, Major, H.P. Tasker of the U.S. Army, and William Hobby, of the War Department, Public Relations Bureau at Washington, D.C. visited here with W/C Mackell, to see the methods of training, organization, and administration of the Women's Division. From here they proceeded to Rockcliffe Air Station.		
	8-3-42		Freezing drizzle in the morning, but flying continued for the remainder of the day and until 2230 hours.		
	9-3-42		No flying. Rain and clouds all day with strong gusty wind. Victory Loan subscriptions raised by \$1350.00 since last reported, making a total of \$6,350.00		
	10-3-42		Snow. Very little flying until later at night.		
	11-3-42		Clear morning, but cloudy in afternoon. Flying all day but no night flying.		
	12-3-42		Overcast with rain and snow. Flying all day and night flying until 2110 when the field became unserviceable.		
	13-3-42		At 2100 hours last night, Harvard 2629 was tipped up on its nose, a C1 crash, as the pilot missed the taxi strip when turning off the runway and ran into soft snow. Pilot was NZ415333 LAC Lye, C.E., who was uninjured, and the accident was assessed as a error in judgment on his part. Another C1 crash occurred when R56223 WO2 Harling D.W.A. struck a tall dead tree in Harvard 3236. This occurred while in formation flying and the leader leg his formation in too low. A Wings Parade was held this afternoon for the graduates of Course 43, and the Wings were presented by the Commanding Officer, Wing Commander MacBrien. Graduating were 65 Canadians and Americans, one of the largest classes graduated at this S.F.T.S. 11 of these are to proceed to C.F.S. Trenton, eff. 29-3-42 to become Instructors, 13 to No. 31 G.R.S. Charlottetown, P.E.I. for reconnaissance work, 6 to 118 (F) Squadron, Dartmouth, N.S. eff. 14-3-42, and 34 to the "Y" Depot eff. 14-3-42, after receiving two weeks leave. The other graduate, R105073. LAC Gillis, W.R. is being posted to the Conversion Training Squadron, Rockcliffe. Twenty-two of these graduates are being commissioned.
