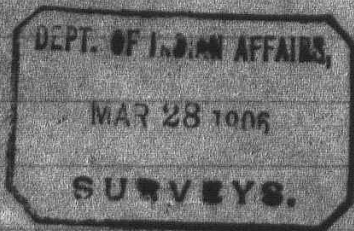
Referring to the difficulty between the Indians of Escumains and Charles Baucher and others, re the road on the Indian reserve. I have the honour to ask the Department to give me permission to visit Escumains in June, to settle the difficulty.

Since a couple of years the Indians and white people of Escumains did not agree very well. The Indians believing all the time that the white people are encroaching on their right. Both parties have complained to me several times by letter, but until now it has been impossible for me to accord them.

Hence my request for permission to go to Escumains whence it will be easier to settle the question, when on the spot. I also beg to say that the Indians of Seven Islands, Moisie, Godbout & Co. have written to me several times, requesting me to visit them. Should the Department think it advisable that a visit be made to those Indians, I could make the visit immediately after my visit of Escumains Indians.
