My dear Jennie:

This is just a little line from Seal Harbor to let you know that you and Rosabel continue to be much in my thoughts. I was sorry not to get a chance to ring you up before starting off at midnight on Friday last, but was very busy up to the time of leaving.

I arrived here at Mr. Rockefeller's seaside home, just at midnight, on Saturday. I am having a delightful visit here. Just what I most needed and most wanted - a chance for quiet talks with him and plenty of opportunity to sleep. By agreement between us, no one is being invited, nor are we accepting engagements to go anywhere but just sharing the hours together and seeing his children and grand-children as opportunity presents

Unfortunately, I am staying only until Thursday night as I will have to be back for Lord Mountbatten's visit to Ottawa. If all well, I shall be at Kingsmere by Saturday of this week.

It looks as though I shall have to go to the United Nations Assembly which meets in Paris in September, and which will mean leaving Canada about the
