### MINERAL WEALTH.

The announcements made by Pre mier Whitney of the new Depart ment of Mines, with a Minister for it, and the probable extension of On tario's boundaries northwards into rich mineral lands, naturally turn men's minds to the question of mineral wealth. It will, therefore, be in teresting to give some figures showing what mining companies of the better class in the United States have to their record. The Cambria Steel Company is credited with having paid \$8,475,000 in dividends on its \$45,-000,000 of issued capital stock. The record of the American Smelting and Refining Company is a total of \$19,-891,553 in dividends on capital stock, common and preferred, aggregating

Foremost among these is the Calmet and Hecla Company, which has won enormous wealth from the copper mines of Lake Superior. Its capital stock amounts to only \$2,500,000, par value, while the corporation has paid dividends aggregating no less than \$88,850,000. The Boston and Montana, another copper mining company, has paid over \$4,000,000 in dividends on a capital of \$3,750,000. The Anaconda Copper Company, which has its mines in Montana, has distributed \$24,450,000 to the owners of stock of the par value of \$30,000,-000, and the big Amalgamated Company, also a producer of Montana Copper, has paid \$27,343,000 on capital stock to the amount of \$155,000,000.

Other remarkably successful copper companies are the Tamarack, a Michigan concern, which has paid \$8,580, 000 on stock to the par value of \$1. 500,000; the Oscmeola, also mining Michigan copper, which has paid \$4, 632,000 on \$2,500,000 of stock; the Quincy, another Michigan mining corporation, which has distributed \$14,920,000 to the owners of stock to the amount of \$2,500,000; and the Arizona Company, called the United Verde, which has paid \$17,085,000 to the holders of shares having the face value of \$3,000,000. The Arizona Company, still another copper mining concern, has paid \$6,180,000 on a capital of \$3,775,000.

These copper mining companies have paid a total of about \$231,000,000 in dividends on stock of the par value of which cannot be approached by companies which have mined the precious metals. Only the wonderful success of the Standard Oil Company makes the showing of the manufacturing group corporations better than that of the leading copper companies.

Gold and silver mining companies tell a different story Among the best of them are the Alaska Treadwell Company, which has paid \$6,-300,000 in dividends earned in gold mining to the owners of stock having the face value of \$5,000,000; the famous Homestake Company, of South Dakota, which has paid \$13,132,000 in dividends on stock of par value of \$21,840,000; the Portland, a gold mining company of Colorado, which has paid \$5,557,000 on stock to the amount of \$3,000,000; and the Standard Consolidated, of California, mining gold and silver, which has a record of \$4,160,000 in dividends on stock to the amount of \$2,000,000 The Silver King, a Utah corporation mines gold, silver and lead, and has paid \$8,850,000 to the owners of \$3,-000,000 in capital stock.
