It is claimed that they are less liable to disease than any other breed, and that their flesh is the most delicate pork, while the live animal is the most hardy. They have grown to an immense size, and are a good breed for crossing with others. In England the Suffolks are considered the most profitable breed. They have most of the good qualities of the Berkshire and are not black. If well kept and taken care of they will make the best selling pork. They were until lately the leading breed in America.
