geen township, Bruce County, 24 miles
north-west of Walkerton, the county seat,
and 5 east of Port Elgin, on Lake Huron,
the nearest railway and banking point.
Settled in 1856. It contains Methodist,
Presbyterian and Baptist churches, and a
public school, and ships grain and live stock.
It is on the daily stage route from Port
Elgin to Tara. Population, 80. Telegraph,
GNW. Mail daily. John A Darling, post-

Grain and live stock are shipped. Stages
daily to Bowmanville, fare 75c, Hampton
50c, Enniskillen 25c, Hayden 35c, Cart-
wright 25c, Cadmus 35c, and Caesarea 40c.
Population, 50. Telegraph, GNW. Ex-
press, Dominion. Mail daily. M E Quig-
ley, postmaster.

BURK'S FALLS. A post office and
station on the N & P J Ry, and on the
Magnetawan River (which furnishes power)

in Armour township, Parry Sound district,
40 miles north of Bracebridge, the nearest
banking point. Settled in 1879. It con-
tains an Episcopal church and public school,
and ships lumber. Stages three times a
week to Huntsville and Sundridge, and boat
daily to Magnetawan and Ahmic Harbour.
Population, 400. Telegraph, GNW. Mail
daily. David F Burk, postmaster.

\$1.50. Population, 50. Mail tri-weekly.

office on the Big Burleigh river (which fur-
nishes power) in Burleigh township, Peter-
borough County, 20 miles north-east of
Peterborough, the county seat, and nearest
banking point, and 10 north of Lakefield,
the nearest shipping point. Settled in 1877.
