tured fourteen, being himself seriously wounded. One Indian walked over 500 miles to enlist. Another, a full-blooded red man, travelled three thousand miles by trail, canoe and steamer to join the forces. Many bands sent to the ranks practically every able-bodied male member of military age.

These are records, concludes the Deputy Superintendent General, which cannot be surpassed by any community in the Dominion.

The Indian work carried on by the Presbyterian Church has fully justified itself and calls for ever greater efforts, as a part of the new Forward Movement.
