

*Thomas Alexis Goffelin*, and to encourage the building of bridges over Rivers, the said *Thomas Alexis Goffelin*, should be permitted to repair his bridge, and be granted the right of Toll for four years; during which time, the public may build a bridge over the same River, but shall be restrained from passing thereon, until the four years are expired

The order of the day for the House to resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the engrossed Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act for the more easy discovery and effectual punishment of buyers and receivers of stolen goods, and monies in cases of petty larceny, and in other cases," being read,

The House resolved itself into the said Committee.

Mr. *M'Cord* took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair;

And Mr. *M'Cord* reported, that the Committee had made some progress, and had directed him to move for leave to sit again.

ORDERED, that the said Committee have leave to sit again.

RESOLVED, that this House will, on Monday next, again resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House on the said Bill.

A Bill more effectually to restrain and punish forestalling in the city and vicinity of *Quebec*, was, according to order, read a second time.

Mr. *Blackwood* moved, seconded by Mr. *Durocher*, that the said Bill be now referred to a Committee of the whole House.

The House divided on the question.
