Thomas Alexis Goffelin, and to encourage the building of bridges over Rivers, the faid Thomas Alexis Goffelin, flould be permitted to repair his bridge, and be granted the right of Toll for four years; during which time, the public may build a bridge over the fame River, but fhall be reftrained from paffing thereon, until the four years are expired

The order of the day for the Houfe to refolve itfelf into a Committee of the whole Houfe, on the engroffed Bill from the Legiflative Council, intituled, "An Act for the more easy difcovery and effectual punifhment of buyers and receivers of ftolen goods, and monies in cafes of petty larceny, and in other cafes," being read,

The House resolved itself into the faid Committee.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. M'Cord took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair;

And Mr. M'Card reported, that the Committee had made fome progrefs, and had directed him to move for leave to fit again.

ORDERED, that the faid Committee have leave to fit again.

RESOLVED, that this Houfe will, on Monday next, again refolve itfelf into a Committee of the whole Houfe on the faid Bill.

A Bill more effectually to reftrain and punish forestalling in the city and vicinity of *Quebec*, was, according to order, read a fecond time.

Mr. Blackwood moved, feconded by Mr Durocher, that the faid Bill be now referred to a Committee of the whole House.

The House divided on the question.
