

The Petition of *William Lee*, being read and considered.

On Motion of *Col. Tonge*, *resolved*, That the Sum of One Hundred Pounds, be granted for the Repair of the Road, leading from the *Wind-  
for* Road to the Township of *Newport*, which in Addition to the One Hundred Pounds granted them last Session completes the Sum voted for that purpose in the Year 1781, and not paid ; the above Sum to be laid out and expended by such Commissioners as His Excellency the Governor may think proper to appoint for that Purpose.

Resolution thereon.

The Petition from *William Black* and others, praying for a Sum of Money to be allowed for the purpose of opening a Road from *Rem-  
shag* to *Amberst*, was read, and *Mr. Watson* one of the Petitioners being heard in support of the Petition, the further consideration of the same was deferred to a future Day.

Petition of *Wm.*  
*Black* read,

*Mr. Wilkins*, moved that in Consideration of the Scarcity of live Cattle at *Shelburne*, and the difficulty of procuring them from the old settled Towns in the Province, this House should address His Excellency the Governor, requesting, that he would be pleased to authorise by Proclamation the Importation of Cattle into the district of *Shelburne* from the *United States* for a limited time conformable to the Royal Proclamation, which being seconded, and put, and the House dividing thereon passed in the Negative.
