A Message from the Council, by Mr. Cogswell :

Mr. Speaker,

The Council have agreed to the resolution of this House of yesterday, respecting the Laws passed since the year 1804.

On motion of Mr. Robie, *Resolved* That Mr. Speaker, Mr. Robie and Mr. Pryor, be a committee to join with a committee of his Majesty's Council, to correspond with the Agent of the Province, on the subject of the General Interests of the Province, during the recess.

*Ordered*, That the Clerk do carry the foregoing resolution to the Council, and desire their concurrence to the same.

The Council have appointed Mr. Attorney General, Judge Hutchinson, and Mr. Black, to join with the committee of this House, for the purpose of corresponding with the Agent of the Province during the recess.

A Message from his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, by Mr. Acting Secretary Cogswell,

Mr. Speaker,

His Excellency commands this House to attend his Excellency immediately in the Council Chamber.

Accordingly Mr. Speaker, with the House, went up to attend his Excellency in the Council Chamber, where his Excellency was pleased to give his Assent to the several Bills following, Viz :

An Act to continue the several Acts of the General Assembly of this Province now in force, relating to a Militia, and in further amendment of the same.

An Act to give power to the Firewards of the Town of Halifax, to prevent dangerous quantities of Gun Powder being kept within the said Town and Harbour thereof.

An Act to regulate the exportation of Ton Timber, and to repeal two Acts made in the twelfth and thirty-third years of His Majesty's reign, declaring what shall be deemed Merchantable Timber for exportation to Great Britain.

An Act to revive and continue the several Acts for regulating the Summary Trial of Actions, before his Majesty's Justices of the Peace, in the Town and Peninsula of Halifax.
