NEW JUDGE ARRIVES

Mr. Justice Macaulay is Home Again

Will Take the Place of Gold Commissioner Senkler on the Court of Appeals.

Mr. Justice Macaulay, accompanied by Mrs. Macaulay and son, arrived today on the Selkirk direct from their old home in Ontario. In the course of a short chat had with a representative of the Nugget Judge Macaulay said he knew nothing new of a political nature, did not know if the election writ had been issued and in fact was at the present time more interested in finding a habitation for himself and family than anything else. The trip inside he described as being very pleasant and he was very glad to get back again

While in Ottawa Judge Macaulay received his commission as a justice of the Yukon territory and he now occupies the same position as his colleagues, Messrs. Justice Dugas and Craig, with the same jurisdiction and powers. Within a day or two he will take the oath of office which will be administered probably by Mr. Justice Dugas, the senior judge of the bench. For the present he will continue to act as police magistrate and will also hear such other cases as may in their regular course of progress come before him. The apcointment of a third judge for the Yukon will alter the personnel of the court of appeal. The new appointee will take the place of Gold Commissioner Senkler on the appellate bench and the latter will thus be spared the necessity of sitting in
