The Younger Canadian Poets.

A nation is great only as she produces great and good men. Commerce, wealth and manufactures are truly valuable only as they conduce to make men better and greater, but in themselves are of a nature changing, fleeting and comparatively valueless.

Among the great and noble of whom a land is proud, the very foremost place has ever been granted the poets. Where lives the Scotchman whose soul does not thrill at the name of Burns? What Irishman but feels his enthusiasm for the Emerald Isle strengthened when he hears the name of Moore pronounced?

Yes! Canada has poets of whom she may be proud; but it is a sad truth that their own countrymen know them not; like the prophets of old they have no honor in their own land.

The poetic literature of Canada has passed its infant stage and is now entering into the period of vigorous youth. Heavy, rugged, and original, they have awakened the first notes are now dead.

But must Canadian poets limit themselves to merely Canadian themes? No; not if they would be truly great. Poets in order to be truly great must not be of any country or of any time, but of all countries and all times.

We should expect to find a great deal of the objective element in her poetry; and this we do find. But natural description, though forming such a large element, is not the only element in her poetic literature.
