## At one of the meetings of the Pan

Protestant Council.

"Rev. A. P. Bousquet traced the

condition of religion in Switzerland.

In German Switzerland the speaker said

that the Protestantism and open revealed

a considerable extent, and public morals

are on such a low plane that it is proposed

to revive the death penalty.

"A report by Rev. Ferdinand Claar,

of Clifton, on the state of religion in

Moravia, stated that the Reformed and

Bohemian Churches in Moravia are se-

riously interfered with in their efforts

to spread the Gospel through the opera-

tionally opposed to Protestantism, prove

so in practical effect.

"Rev. Antonio Arrighio, spoke of the

Free Church of Italy, and invited the

Council to fix on some for the meeting

of the fourth General Council, remarking

that by that time the Vatican, which

would accommodate sixty thousand peo-

ple, would be in the possession of Pro-

testants.

The wish was father to the thought in

"Rev. Mr. Revons spoke in behalf of

French Protestantism in French, his re-

marks being interpreted by Rev. Mr.

Dodds. The speaker said a few months

ago he saw a petition in which the mem-

bers of a Municipal Council in France

asked for change of the form of wor-

ship from Roman Catholic to Protestant.

He asserted that 300 out of the 400 mun-

icipal officers in France would be glad to do

the same."
