The value of the lumber was given at one time as more than \$100,000 but through a falling market and various adjus tments, the claim of the plaintiff is now about \$81.000.

Writs have been served on nine of the companies carrying insurance upon the stock. It is hoped how eves, to arrive at a settlement through arbitration, and pending a solution in this connection a stay of proceedings was asked for this morn
