NEW ZEALAND IS READY TO DO HER PART IN NEAR EAST

London, Oct. 3—Premier W. F. Massey, of New Zealand, says a Reuter despatch from Wellington in addressing a country electorate, said "It is very disappointing to us all to realize that, while we are still troubled by the aftermath of the Great War we may be called upon again to do our duty to our country and empire, but if clash comes, I know I am right in saying the people of New Zealand will stand up to it and do their duty and take the consequences, whatever they may be. The future is in the hands of Providence. All we can do is to leave it there, and hope for the best."

Found Guilty Of Manslaughter For Killing Her Child

Hamilton, Ont., Oct. 3—Elsie Beaver, Brantford, was found guilty by a jury this morning of manslaughter in connection with the death of her infant child. The body was found in a valise shortly after its birth and an autopsy showed that paper had been stuffed into the throat of the child and that this was the cause of its death. Sentence will be passed tomorrow.

St. John-Digby Steamer Off Rocks

St. John, Oct. 3—The C. P. R. steamer Empress, running on the St. John-Digby route, which went ashore on the rocks near St. John on Friday evening last, was taken off at ten o'clock tonight. During the day the rock on which she rested amidships had been blasted away while the tide was out. The steamer was brought to St. John and appears to be little the worse for her experience.

Suit Is Dismissed

The suit of the King vs. Nashwaak Pulp & Paper Co., Ltd. for damage done the roadbed of the Fredericton-Newcastle sub-division of the C. N. R. by the Nashwaak River above Marysville, has been dismissed.

This case was tried in Fredericton in July before His Lordship Judge Audet of the exchequer court of Canada and occupied four days and one night session. Counsel for the crown were P. J. Hughes, of Fredericton and Raleigh Trites, of Moncton, and for the defendant company W. H. Harrison, of St. John, and J. J. P. Winslow, of Fredericton.

The suit arose out of the wreck of a freight train which ran into the bridge above Marysville. John Estabrooks, of Fredericton, and Frank Childs of Newcastle, lost their lives. The suit was \$25,000.

A New Record At Dalhousie

Halifax, Oct. 5—Expectations that the registration at Dalhousie University would exceed all previous years were more than realized when the regular registration period came to a close last night.

Six hundred and eighty six students were enrolled for the various courses of study as compared with six hundred and twenty five at the end of the second day last year.

Indications are that the total attendance will reach close to seven hundred and fifty by the time all of the late comers have arrived which will give an increase of about fifty over the final registration of the 1921-22 session.

Keep Lumber At Home

Oriental Countries Exhausting American Supply

"Home owning has always been an American ideal. One reason so many Americans have been able to realize that ideal has been the abundance of and cheapness of building material. Houses built of costly material must belong to the few who have wealth or to the landlords."

"From 1870 to 1900 Michigan was producing more lumber than any other state. Cheap lumber and low freight rates made Michigan a state of home owners. But the policy of slashing timber and not replacing it chased the lumber producing area across the continent, and today Michigan is paying more for freight on lumber than the lumber costs where it is cut."

"Meanwhile the last great timber stand in the United States is on the Pacific Coast. But the experience of rising pricing of lumber and declining number of home owners seems to teach us nothing. We still proceed upon the theory that the trees grew because Providence wanted certain lumbermen to make a fortune. Accordingly it is perfectly proper for said lumbermen to cut the trees and market the lumber in the way best intended to make their fortunes quickly."

"Just now the Japanese seem to be the instruments adapted to carry out this purpose. They like lumber and they are buying the best American grades. Statistics furnished by the National Lumber Manufacturers' Association Information Bureau say: During the first three months of 1922, the Japanese took 119,000,000 feet of lumber from the State of Washington, and 54,271,000 feet from Oregon. China also is coming to the front as a buyer of American lumber."

"There is much talk of a forestry policy. In the immediate interests of home building we need much more a lumber policy which will keep for the use of the American people the rapidly falling supply of timber. It is time to forbid sending the best of our lumber to Asia while our people are compelled to pay exorbitant prices for the culls."

SCOTTISH CURLERS TO COME TOST. JOHN

Bonspiel to be Held Here Next Winter

A bonspiel here this winter, at which teams from the different New Brunswick clubs will compete against the Scotch curlers who will tour Canada under the auspices of the Royal Caledonian Curling Association, is scheduled under the tentative programme prepared by J. Bruce Stewart, Montreal, general secretary for Canada, according to advice given by Mr. Stewart to J. A. Sinclair, president of the N. B. branch of the Royal Caledonian Association. There is no foundation for the report that the bonspiel would be held in Fredericton Mr. Sinclair was informed.

In a conference with Secretary Stewart, at Montreal, Mr. Sinclair had it arranged that should the Scotch curlers land at Halifax they will be routed here after playing in Nova Scotia; should they land at St. John they will play here before proceeding to Halifax.

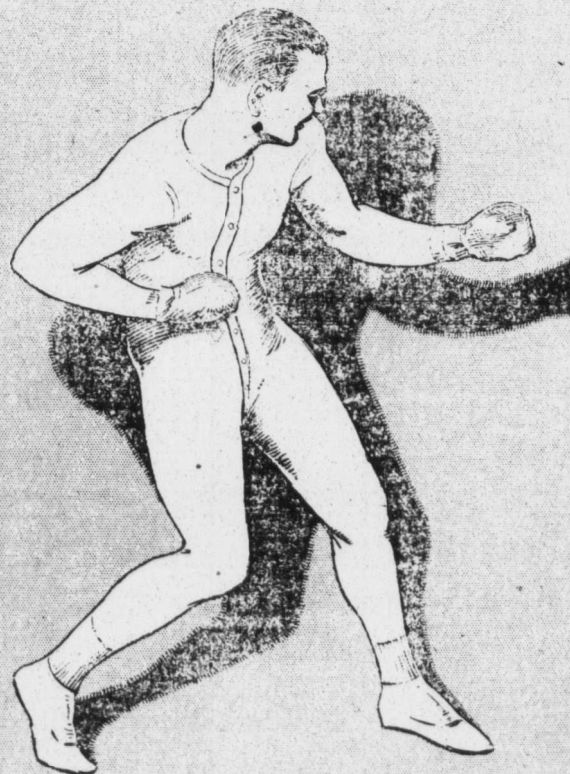
