ask the Minister of Public Works what arrangements are being made for providing Hospital Facilities for children, that is to say, special provision made now for the admission and treatment of children in the Hospital and if so, what the cost and what rate per bed is being provided or is to be charged, and in the Minister's Hospital and for what extent the Hospital rates are charged or to be charged.

P. F. Moore gave notice that he would ask the Hon. the Prime Minister to purchase any copies of a book called "The Star," has in course of publication, and if so, how many copies and at what price.

Mr. Bennett gave notice that he would ask the Hon. Prime Minister, in the absence of the Minister of Marine Fisheries, to lay on the Table House a copy of the correspondence, if any, in connection with enquiring by this Colony of the ship "Lobelia" now lying in the port of St. John's; and if no correspondence exists, a statement describing the circumstances, also a statement of the cost of the ship and of altering, equipping or refitting the ship for her voyage to this country; a statement of the cost of maintenance and operation at the time of her arrival in this country; and a statement of the present view in acquiring this ship; and if she has been in this country for many months without being put to any use, what does the Government do with her thereafter? that he would also ask the Hon. the Prime Minister to lay on the Table of the House a report showing the nature of the alterations and improvements in the General Post Office, and the cost of the same, whether or not it is intended to make these improvements the year.

P. E.
