WASHINGTON, Dec. 27. The United States exports to Canada November were valued at \$41,194,-000 as compared with \$44,800,000 in October. Imports received from Canada were \$10,875,000 as compared with \$9,469,000 in October. United States exports to Britain were \$60,900,000 in November as compared with \$84,953,-000 in October. Imports from Britain were \$21,218,000 as compared with \$19,215,000. During the first eleven months of the year the U.S. exported merchandise valued at \$4,189,343,000 while the imports for the same period were \$2,271,797,000 according to figures issued by the Commerce Department to day Last year for the same period A Pleasure to-day. Last year for the same period the exports were \$7,757,219,000 and the imports \$5,012,424,000.
