
S. Coal Fields Now Idle - Moorish Tribesmen Cut Up French Column - Royal Assent Given Irish Free State Bill.

NEW YORK, March 31. - About 100,000 Union miners quit to-day in the bituminous and anthracite coal fields to enforce the wage contracts.

FRENCH KILLED IN SURPRISE ATTACK.
LONDON, March 31. - Seven hundred men belonging to French columns have been killed wounded in a surprise attack by Moors in French Morocco, according to a despatch to the Times.

NOW LAW.
LONDON, March 31. - The Irish Free State Bill became to-day when King George gave assent to the measure.

TOO EARLY TO REJOICE.
LONDON, March 31. - Speaking to the new Irish Free State to-day, Winston Churchill said as not yet time to rejoice over the development, as there was period of anxiety and uncertainty. He said there was complete silence in the good will of the signatures of the Treaty, but

DESTRUCTIVE FIRE IN THE BAHAMAS.
MIAMI, Florida, March 31. - The three hundred room Colonial Hotel, Nassau, Bahama Islands, was destroyed to-day by a fire which threatened the destruction of most of the city, according to a radio message. The conflagration caused damage running into millions.

MALCONTENTS BUSY.
LONDON, March 31. - Irish Republican Army insurgents held up a train at Newton Cunningham, County Donegal, and burned all newspapers. Insurgents ejected the Free State troops from the barracks at Carradonagh and Moville.

ADMIRALTY EXPLOSIVES SEIZED.
LONDON, March 31. - Raiders to-day seized a cargo of explosives aboard an Admiralty ship off the Irish coast and stowed safely away in an unknown place, according to a Cork despatch to the Times.

SNOW AND SLEET IN ONTARIO.
TORONTO, March 31. - Communications in Western Ontario have not been so badly crippled for years as to-night following a storm of snow and sleet for two days.

CANADIAN RAILWAY STATISTICS.
OTTAWA, March 31. - Sixty-one million passengers were carried on Canadian railways last year. Four were killed and 240 injured. The total railway employees were 187,177, and ninety of these were killed and 1344 injured.

AN APPEAL FROM JUGO-SLAVIA.
PARIS, March 31. - The French Foreign Office has received a note from the Government of Jugoslavia, suggesting that Britain and France co-operate to re-



A FOOLISH WOMAN.
I happened to be at a friend's house the other evening when her husband came home and announced that one of the officials of the A. F. M. for which he works would be in town sometime in the coming month and that they would probably entertain him.

My friend has a lovely home and plenty of service so that did not mean to her what it means to the woman who wonders at once if she can't manage to get those much needed new draperies for the guest room, and whether she can get the neighborhood accommodator to come in and serve the meals during the visit.

"Wouldn't it be Terrible!"

And yet a shadow passed at once over her face. "Oh, dear," she said, "I do hope that he won't happen to come at the same time the Farleys are in town. You know they did so much for us when we were away this summer and we said so much about entertaining them when they came to town. Wouldn't it be terrible if they should happen to come the very time he is here and we couldn't entertain them? That would be just my luck."

Now, fond as I am of this woman, I must admit that that reaction is typical of her.

Her first thought on hearing anything new seems almost always to be a fear thought.

She is always saying, "suppose this or that should happen." In short she has the fixed habit of fear and it colors all her outlook on life.

Until She Knows.
Until she makes sure that the Farleys will not come at the same time that her husband's guest is to be in town, her feeling about both visits will be one of apprehension.

Of course it is possible that the two might coincide and that embarrassments might arise.

But the ordinary person would never think of that contingency until it presented itself and would thereby avoid that much apprehension.

If my friend's fears translated themselves into action to avert the thing she fears that would be another thing. But they seldom do; by the nature of things that is often impossible. If anything, they make her less capable of

dealing with any difficulties that arrive because fear always clouds the mind and faculties.

Set the Hope Reaction.
A great many people, I think, have this instinctive fear reaction. It can be overcome and it should be overcome for the sake of one's happiness and efficiency. The way to go about it is to try to force one's mind away from dwelling on fears, and to substitute for the fear reaction the hope reaction. You can't control events by this but you can fill your life with the stimulus of hope instead of the depression of fear.

For All Laborers.

N.I.W.A. NOT INVIDIOUS.
With regard to the resolutions of the Newfoundland Industrial Workers' Association, forwarded the Council at its regular meeting, it would appear from the report of the proceedings that the petition was mainly on behalf of the Association. This is not the case, as the N.I.W.A. stands for labor of all kinds in the city. As non-residents are being given preference over city workmen, who are taxpayers, it was the opinion of the Association that contractors and other employers of labor should give consideration to citizens first. If this was done much of the present destitution through unemployment, would be relieved; and it was with this object in view that the resolutions were submitted to the Council. -Com.
